

### **BRIAN:** A HOPE BUILDERS SUCCESS STORY

Since 2021, Walt Disney Imagineering and two of its general contractors—W.E. O'Neil and Clark Construction Group—have linked their subcontractors to Hope Builders
Career Connections (HBCC), the agency's social enterprise staffing agency, as a hiring source for the reimagined Mickey's Toontown, newest parking structure, a timeshare tower opening later this year and upcoming transformation of Splash Mountain into Tiana's Bayou Adventure.
To date, over 27 young adults have found employment through HBCC on such projects.



At 23, Brian came to Hope Builders looking to make a change in his life. He heard about the program from his girlfriend who was applying to its health-care training program. "I felt stuck working retail and figured I had nothing to lose," Brian recalls. He dreamt of a career in construction so he also submitted an application.

During his 12 weeks of training, Brian mastered the fundamentals of construction while showing up for work on time and ready to work. Brian reflects, "Hope Builders gave me a sense of direction in my life and also taught me new skills like better communication and time management."
