

Ana got pregnant at 16 and was subsequently disowned by her father. Her self-esteem and mental health suffered for many years. Despite working over 40 hours each week Ana was still living paycheck to paycheck. "I wanted to go back to school and start my career in the medical field, I just didn't know how." At 23, Ana applied to Hope Builders for the third time, finally ready to commit to the program.

During her 20-week training program, Ana shares "the staff helped me overcome my battle with selfconfidence. It's so different than any other program because they provided me unconditional support to achieve my goals and start a career." She continued to work to support her son and admits, "it was a struggle, but with the support I received, I was able to finish the program."
